VERY IMPORTANT: When you purchased your tickets you should have been prompted to enter the email address for the account you used to register for <https://warhorn.net/events/avl-scarefest-10>. YOU MUST HAVE AN ACCOUNT and have registered for our event to sign up for games when they open on September 19 (September 18 for GMs, Minions, Minionettes, and Patrons--Yes, that means there are real and definite perks to helping us out, so if you haven't volunteered--it's not too late!).

In any event, you'll want to keep an eye on the Discord (or your email, if you're signed up for our newsletter) so that you see the notification when games are open for signup (most games have limited seating, so the faster you get in there the more likely you are to wind up with everything you want).

Other Stuff You Need To Know:

When you arrive at Lake Junaluska Conference Center, you'll go first to the Bethea Welcome Center (A) to collect your keys for your lodging and your meal tickets. Then proceed to Shackford Hall (E) which is where all gaming events will take place. You'll be able to pick up your ticket and registration packet (loot!!) along with any other goodies you ordered in advance at the Registration Desk just inside the central gaming hall.

Parking is available all over the grounds, and you are welcome to park anywhere a space is available.

If you are coming for the setup/decorating on Thursday (please do! We need all the help we can get!), we'll be in Shackford Hall from around noon until we're done (figure 6-7PM--yes, it takes that long--see why we need help?!), and then will move to the lobby of the Lakeside Lodge (5).

When you get to registration, you will be given a convention program. Please read it.

There is stuff in there you actually need to know, we promise. The Overlord works incredibly hard on making that thing, and they like to feel appreciated. Also, it's full of games and pictures, to make it as palatable as possible. It's worth your time. Promise.

We strongly encourage everyone to come in costume, and please bring your own coffee/tea mug. Fishing and Boating Regulations

Lake Junaluska is a private community and conference center, including the lake, that is made available to the public for recreation. Fishing is permitted only in designated areas following the regulations of the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission. There is no fishing after dark. Fishermen should be sensitive to waterfowl and swans. More information can be found at nowildlife.org. Fishing licenses are available at Ace Hardware located at 1391 Dellwood Rd, Waynesville, N.C. 28786 (0.5 miles west of Lake Junaluska on Hwy 19 West).

No boats using gasoline or diesel fuel are allowed on the waters of the lake. Boating access for boats on trailers is available at the Hwy 19 boat ramp. Other vessels may be launched from either the Hwy 19 boat ramp or the boat beach located to the north of the Aquatic Center on Memory Lane.
